As a 7-year-old boy, Bill Sackter's life was in turmoil. After his father died in 1920, the State of Minnesota determined that his mental retardation would make him a burden on society, so he was locked up in an institution, never to see his family again.

It took 44 years for Bill to finally be released from Faribault Institution. And while he had freedom, he was languishing on the streets of Minneapolis.

A chance meeting with a young college student, Barry Morrow, led to an incredible friendship and a new journey for Bill. Barry introduced Bill to a whole new side life and many new friends, and took the extraordinary step of becoming his legal guardian.

This unlikely pairing allowed Bill's vibrant personality and zest for life to blossom.
